You will be aware that the school had a Section 50 inspection and an Estyn interim visit during the first half of the Summer Term. A Section 50 inspection is a statutory inspection of schools with a religious character and an Estyn interim visit concentrates on the progress made by the school since the last core inspection. Both are held at short notice to capture a true picture.

I'm delighted to say that both inspections went really well and reflect very favourably on the school. They identify many strengths and spotlight areas of best practice. The Section 50 report comments on the bright, warm and welcoming environment for learning and the strong sense of guardianship the pupils have. 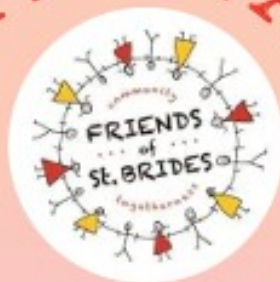
