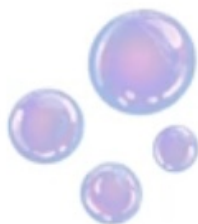

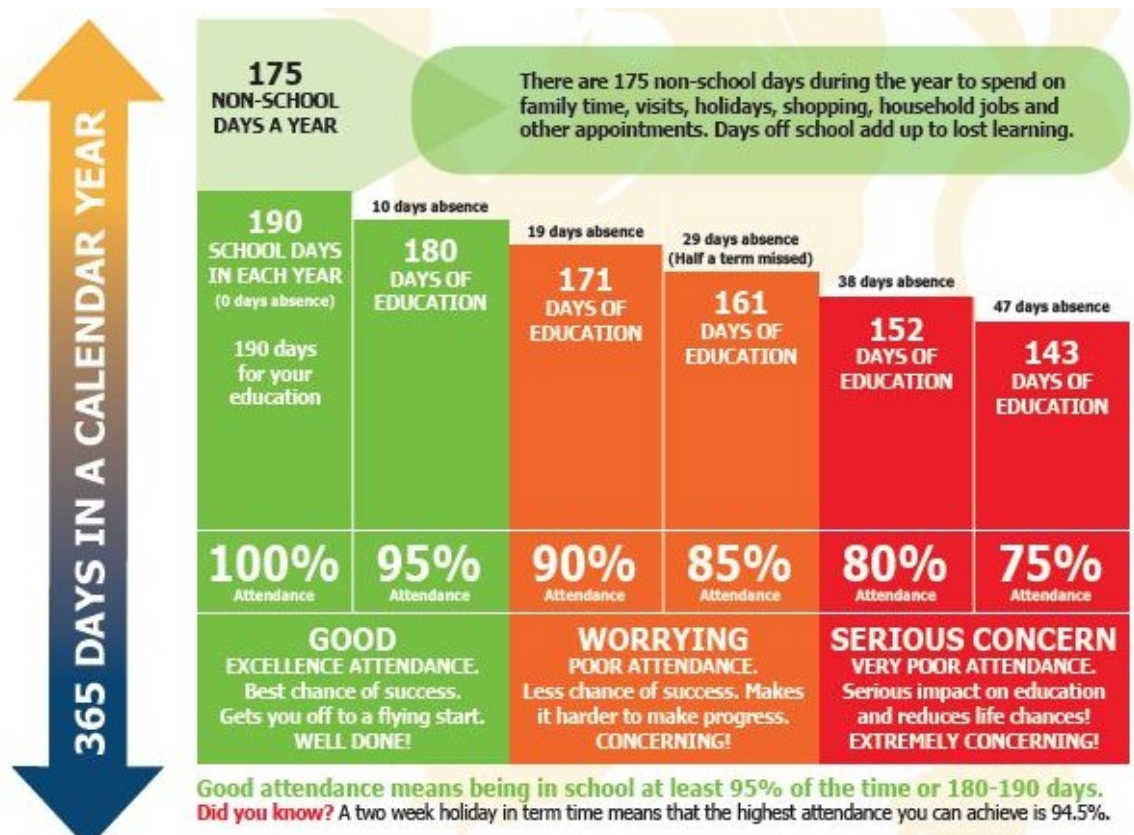

Attendance Matters

Today you received an attendance figure included with your child's school report, this informs you of your child's attendance as a percentage figure between the start of the school year and the current time. I ask all parents to set the highest of expectations for attendance for your child. Please compare your child's attendance to our 97% attendance expectation.

I appreciate that the percentage figure that you will receive does not take into account authorised absences such as hospital appointments. It is simply a percentage of the school year that your child has been in school.



IMPORTANT - No parking in turning circle

Could I remind all parents, guardians, grandparents etc. not to park in the turning circle at the beginning / end of the school day. We have noticed an increase in this recently. Some parents are even moving the school's traffic cones and parking on the yellow 'Keep Clear' lines. We need to keep this area calm and clear to provide increased visibility.
